Why do I Need two Appointments for a Crown? BY THE SMILES FOR LIFE TEAM

Many people have a crown - some people call them caps - but do you know why it takes two appointments to complete your crown treatment? The first appointment is to "prep" the tooth. This will involve removing any decay, any old fillings material and making sure the remaining tooth structure is strong. We then take an impression of the prep to send to a certified dental lab. Our experience show we get the best results from them lab, rather than doing in house "same day" crowns. The lab specializes in making crowns from various materials and colors to give you the best fit and best "look". Since it takes time for the lab to make the crown, we send you home with a temporary crown for you to wear until the final crown is ready. Once it is ready, the temporary crown is removed and the final crown is placed. You are now ready to chew your favorite foods and smile big and pretty. Just remember, there is a tooth under the crown, so great home care is the best way to protect your investment in your new crown.

When to Replace a Filling With a Crown? BY THE SMILES FOR LIFE TEAM

It can be tricky to know when you should replace your filling with a crown, but knowing what to look out for can always be helpful. A few reasons you might need to replace your filling with a crown could include:

- If the filling has decay and covers multiple surfaces of your tooth
- If it is an old silver filling. They can act as a wedge in the teeth and cause bigger issues like cracks and breaking.
- If your current filling covers more than 50% of the tooth it could begin causing sensitivity.

Luckily, our awesome patients are really good about maintaining their oral health, but if you are concerned feel free to give us a call. Our doctors are very highly trained, and they continue to gain even more knowledge through frequent continuing education classes.
